## Nonprofit COVID-19 Network in Warren County

**Introduction:** United Way of Warren County & Warren County Community Services are partnering with Warren County Commissioner Shannon Jones to coordinate COVID-19 communication in the nonprofit sector. Nobody knows the future of COVID-19, except that we'll see many additional needs develop. Additional funds, already scarce in the nonprofit sector, are needed in order to plan for previously unanticipated demand for private nonprofit services. This project involves Warren County non-profit organizations in helping minimize duplication of services and maximizing the value of scarce resources.

**Project Summary:** The coordination of reliable information noted above, combined with ongoing assessment of emerging demand trends resulting from COVID-19, allows identification of where resources are best directed. The funding provided through this proposal allows us to pro-actively monitor and best react to them.

### Phase Three – Meeting High Demand

Phase Three establishes the Warren County Emergency Relief Fund at the Warren County Foundation, initially funded by WCF and other non-profits. The Fund will provide matching funds to nonprofits who are assisting laid-off workers, housing and rental assistance, food and medication, and homebound senior citizens. Funding will focus on high-need populations that end up in immediate financial crisis with any disruption. We will target services that will have the most impact on speeding up the human and economic recovery from COVID-19.

**Methodology for Short-Term Response:** Flexibility and agility are critical at this stage of COVID-19 nonprofit response. In order to get ahead of backlogs this crisis will create, the Warren County Foundation will establish the Warren County Emergency Relief Fund. Initial funds are provided by WCF and others non-profits are asked to contribute to the Fund. The short-term emergency relief funds will allow UWWC/WCCS/WCF to start assembling 50% matches from Nonprofit COVID-19 Network to address critical needs arising from COVID-19.
